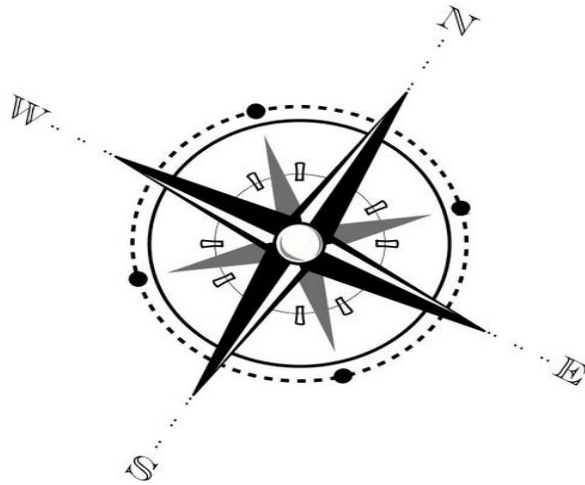

Services: Mental health services available by licensed psychologists, who provide individual, marital, and partner counseling.

Eligibility/Population Served: Services are provided to children 5 years and older, with a focus on 12-19 year olds as well as counseling to adults 21 years and older.

Services: Outpatient services for persons with addictions including chemical assessment, evaluations, treatment planning, drug rehabilitation, gambling treatment, individual and group therapy, and groups for DUI/DWI offenders.

The Center for Victims of Torture (CVT)

Services: Recovery from physical and psychological trauma caused by torture. Services are confidential, comprehensive, and based on need, not ability to pay. Clients receive multidisciplinary services: psychotherapy, social services, nursing care, general medical exam, psychiatry, and physical therapy.

Eligibility/Population Served: Survivors of physical or mental torture and their families. CVT is unable to service anyone who is currently chemically-dependent or a perpetrator of torture.

Chemical Health Department Services: Chemical health assessment, DWI violation mandated chemical health classes; adult primary outpatient treatment and co-occurring disorders outpatient treatment (Rule 31 approved), aftercare, Alcoholics Anonymous (AA meetings), Narcotic Anonymous (NA meetings), and case management.
