Attention, Students! New procedure for ordering textbooks

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May, 2006

The Adler Graduate School will no longer have a physical bookstore beginning with Summer Session I, 2006.

Required texts for summer and subsequent terms will have to be ordered from our online vendor, MBS Direct at: <http://direct.mbsbooks.com/alfredadler.htm>.

Our new bookstore site at mbsbooks.com is still under construction and so far lists no books for sale.

The books will be listed by course number, as they are now, but will be on the MBS site instead of ours. Supplemental and

optional materials will continue to be listed on our site, but AGS will have no stock of books to sell.

MBS will offer used as well as new texts for sale (when available), something which was never an option in our own bookstore. MBS Direct will also purchase used texts from our students and alumni for resale to new students at the Adler Graduate School, the Adler School of Professional Psychology (Chicago) and other schools.

Books will have to be ordered 1-2 weeks before classes begin to ensure timely and cost-effective delivery. All orders are shipped within 24 hours of receipt, excluding weekends. Students can pay for books with major credit and debit cards, financial aid, personal checks and money orders.

The Adler Graduate School is pleased to announce that on Friday, June 9th, from 9:00 a.m.– 4:00 p.m., Dr. Marina Bluvshstein will present a full-day workshop on counseling new immigrants who have settled in the Twin Cities

as well as in other areas of Minnesota.

The new immigrant populations in Minnesota have caused practitioners to question the effectiveness of traditional methods of counseling,

therapy and teaching. First and second generation immigrants do not necessarily respond to classical therapeutic approaches.

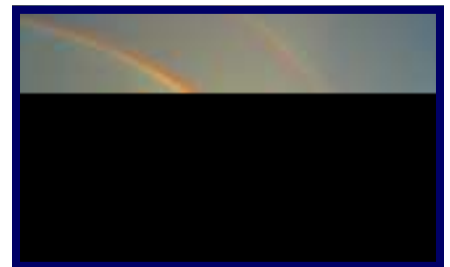
