Frank Walton to speak at Adler Graduate School

For several years, the Student Association at the Adler Graduate School has sponsored a fall program called, "The Adlerian Connection."

This year's program features Dr. Frank Walton who is scheduled to speak on Thursday evening, November 16th at AGS.

Dr. Walton is a licensed counseling psychologist in

private practice in South Carolina.

He completed his undergraduate work at John Carroll University in Cleveland, Ohio. He earned his Masters of Education degree at the College of William and Mary, and a Ph.D. in Psychological Services in Education at the University of South Carolina. He then completed post-doctoral work at the Adler School of Professional Psychology in Chicago.

Dr. Walton has been a teacher, counselor, coach, professor and school board chairman.

He is Past President of NASAP and an adjunct faculty member at the Adler

School of Professional Psychology in Chicago.

He has also served on the board of directors of ICASSI and the South Carolina Child Care Association.

For twenty-six summers, Dr. Walton has been a member of the faculty of ICASSI and has taught in fourteen countries.

He is a consultant on such topics as Attention Deficit/Hyperactivity Disorder, winning the cooperation of children and adolescents in home and school, the counseling of children and adolescents, and the prevention of teen suicide.

Library News

Effective October 1, 2006:

Books from the General Collection (excluding non-circulating Adler Collection and Reference Collection items) can be checked out for 1 month.

However, books may be recalled after 2 weeks for another patron and books may only be renewed a maximum of two additional times (for a total of 3 months), after which they must be returned.

Audio-Visual materials (tapes, CD's, DVD's, etc.) may be checked out for one week, but will be non-renewable.

Fines with circulating items will be charged a late fee of \$.50 per day (\$1.00 per day for recalled items) up to a maximum of \$25.00 per item.

If an item is not returned, the borrower will be subject to replacement costs, \$10.00 processing fee and

any applicable fine (up to the \$25.00 maximum per item).

Nearly 8 % of children and young adults meet the diagnostic criteria for AD/HD. Frequently they experience problems in school, work, marriage and parenting.

Counseling and psychotherapy are typically unsuccessful without direct treatment of the AD/HD condition.

This workshop focuses on diagnosis and treatment. Specific strategies that therapists

can use to help clients deal with their AD/HD-related problems will be offered.
