Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund – Student Disclosure

- 1. Adler Graduate School has signed and returned the Certification and Agreement to the Department of Education for funding under the CARES Act, CRRSAA and ARP programs. These programs to students through the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund (HEERF).
- 2. Adler Graduate School is approved for \$26,910 in funding from CARES (HEERF I), \$26,910 infunding from CRRSAA (HEERF II), and \$80,915 in funding from ARP (HEERF III). \$134,735 total funding for students.
- 3. \$134,735 has been distributed to students.
- 4. 230 students were eligible for funding.
- 5. 230 students have received an Emergency Financial Aid Grant.
- 6. Awards ranged from \$410 \$600 based on calculations including:
 - Enrollment level since the declaration of the pandemic in March 2020
 - Enrollment in Internship program which demonstrates financial hardship
- 7. Students were advised they may use an emergency grant to pay for any component of their cost of attendance, including an outstanding account balance and/or tuition and fees, as well as for emergency costs that arise due to coronavirus, such as food, housing, health care (including mental health care) or child care.
