Graduates are prepared to pursue licensure as a Licensed Professional Clinical Counselor in the state of Minnesota. Postdegree supervision toward full licensure will be required.

Marriage, Couples, and Family Counseling

Graduates are prepared to pursue licensure as a Licensed Marriage and Family Therapist in the state of Minnesota. Post-degree supervision toward full licensure will be required.

Admission Requirements: Master's Programs

- Bachelor's degree (BA/BS) from an accredited institution
- Cumulative Grade Point Average of 3.0 or better
- · Three credits in psychology or a related field
- · Completed application file, including an interview

Additional Art Therapy Requirements

- 18 studio art credits in drawing, painting, and clay work
- Art portfolio featuring 15–20 examples



How To Apply

1. Complete Our Online Application

Our application typically takes less than 15 minutes to complete, and you may resume at any time. Go to apply.alfredadler.edu to begin your application.

2. Submit A Personal Goal Statement

Include a 500-word statement (250 words for certificate admission) outlining the following:

- Your interest in Adler Graduate School
- Your purpose of study
- Past professional and relevant personal experiences
- Areas of growth and strength
- Commitment to serving diverse communities

3. Submit Official Transcripts

Official transcripts from undergraduate and graduate institutions previously attended must be sent directly from the institution.

4. Provide a Letter of Recommendation

A recommendation may be professional (manager or internship supervisors, for example), academic (former professors or mentors), or other influential individuals in your life other than immediate family members.
